Data center and Colocation providers in the United States typically incorporate an AICPA set of standards, which is divided into three SOC types. PCI DDS and HIPAA standards have become widely incorporated compliance standard among their specific industries as well.

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SSAE 16

The Statements on Standards for Attestation Engagements No. 16 is a set of auditing standards from the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants acting as a way for third parties to measure levels and types of compliance.

SAS 70

SAS 70, or the Statement on Auditing Standards No. 70, is the set of standards that was in place for nearly 18 years before being replaced by SSAE 16.

SOC 2

Service Organization Controls 2 involves examination of adherence to and testing of controls for specific "Trust Services Principles" (TSP) of criteria within five reportable sections (Security, Availability, Processing Integrity, Confidentiality, and Privacy).

SOC 3

Service Organization Controls 3 involves a report focused on whether or not an entity meets the required standards and does not include the specific test methods, results, or opinions of the examiner.

PCI DDS

The Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard, or PCI DSS, is a set of regulations and information security standards for organizations that handle card holder information.

HIPAA

The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, or HIPAA, encompasses several rules, all of which are dedicated to the protection of individually identifiable health information.
